

GENERAL INFORMATION

- **THIMUN-definition:** “a formal statement of a proposal to a UN Council, Committee or Commission. It consists of one long, but coherent, sentence divided into clauses and subclauses.”
 - Includes comprehensive solutions concerning the topic
 - It may only propose solutions, not enforce ones
- appropriate language

STEPS

- **Step 1:** Read the Study Guide → detailed information on the topic, useful statistics and even recommendations for solutions
- **Step 2:** Research (always consider your country's policy).
- **Step 3:** Begin with:

THE LEGAL COMMITTEE,

Recognizing counterfeit medicines “A medicine made by someone other than the genuine manufacturer, by copying or imitating an original product without authority or rights. Counterfeit medicines infringe trademark law”,

Expressing concern knowing that 250,000 people have lost their lives after being treated with false medicine,

Emphasizing on the trade of counterfeit pharmaceuticals that is worth up to \$200bn annually,

Keeping in mind the cost of substandard and fake antimalarial drugs on health systems which rises up to \$38.5m per year as well as the 116,000 deaths they cause,

1. Urges Member States to increase awareness among young people in schools by organising seminars with professionals and introducing a unit named “Counterfeit medicine” in the curriculum of biology about the topic “falsified medicines”, in order to:

- a) prevent students from recurring to cheaper medicines they can access without doctoral

- approval, which are potentially falsified by:

- i. consulting them to look for the common identification logo on legal online pharmacies
 - ii. advising them to prefer buying medicinal products from drugstores over online pharmacies, since the danger of deceit is much lower
 - iii. telling them to look for uncommon size or package differences of the medicine before purchasing it

PREAMBULATORY CLAUSES

- Preambulatory clauses deliver the background information upon a specific topic
- Here you can find some phrases that you can use at the beginning of each preambulatory clause:

OPERATIVE CLAUSES

- A clause in a written instruction detailing the practical policy you want implemented if the resolution passes

Operative clauses:

SUB-CLAUSES AND SUB-SUB-CLAUSES

- Specify the solution and add further explanation for its successful implementation
- Sub-clauses are numerated with letters e.g. a), b), c) etc.
- Sub-sub-clauses are numerated with Latin numbers e.g. I, II, III, IV etc.

DETAILS FOR A FINER FORMATTING

- **Semi colons** separating operative clauses
- **Colons** separating operative clause and sub-clauses/sub-sub clauses
- Writing phrases out before adding an acronym (e.g. United Nations would be listed in its full form, prior to using UN as an acronym).
- The lack of a comma after each sub-clause
- **First letters** of sub-clauses and sub-sub clauses not capitalized
- **Operative clause numbers align with pre-ambulatory clauses**
- Indents
